MICMYW KD.

Once settled by Early 19th c.-

Once settled by John Tucker, blacksmith.

TUCKER RD.

Once the site of Senator Richardson's home. Intersects with Long Hill Rd.

RICHARDSON RD.

Winding 'ragged Hill, old maples, scenic views.Highest hill in town.

RAGGED HILL RD.

PIERCE RD.

schoolhouse at juncand Pierce Rds.

Stone walls, open fields, site of old schoolhouse at junction of Ragged Hill

Gently curving, tree-lined, affording many scenic views across fields, valleys and through woodlands.; site of Suicide Rock- 1840.

NEM BKAINTREE RD.

(1812); scenic views.

Site of old Methodist Burial Ground

LYONS RD.

Scenic quality of views West to Mt. Tom. Retains stone walls, second growth maples, and vistas both to the East and to the West.

KENNEDA KD*

Steep, winding, tree-lined road, connecting with Ragged Hill.

Site of first grist mill in the Brookfields, John Pynchon's Mill.

Site of original settlement of Quaboag Plantation(originally called Pritchard Hill 1660); site of the siege of Brookfield (1675) during King Phillip's War, Hon. Jedediah Foster homesite and law office, who helped frame the Massachusetts Constitution. George Whitefield Rock designating the spot where the 18th c. travelling preacher sermonized: one of the first founders of Methodism.

FOSTER HILL RD.

Early military road and teamster road, leads to early settlement homes.
Stone bridge. Road discontinued:
trail on the Brookfield and W. Brookfield line off of George Allen Rd.

• DEAIL'S ELBOW RD.

Retains many of the characteristics of the settlement lanes, lined with maple trees, showing stone wall property delineation.

DAVIS RD.

Named for Richard Coy, one of the first settlers in the Quaboag Plantation 1660. Lucy Stone's birthplace: 1818-1893, Abolitionist, feminist, first woman from Massachusetts to graduate from College (Oberlin). Stone barn foundation remnants. Included in West Brookfield Walldlife Management Area.

COX HILL RD.

Narrow woodland lane off of Coy Hill Rd. Early settlement area.

• BEYWYN KD.

Listed alphabetically

These roads were considered by the Historical Commission to be of historical significance and were approved and designated Scenic Roads on August 23, 1973. One of these roads dates back to 1673. On May 9, 1989 John Gilbert Road was added to the list of Scenic Roads.

WHAT DOES IT MEAN?

West Brookfield adopted the Scenic Road Act as a means of protecting the scenic character of designated roads at Town Meeting in 1973. Many towns in Massachusetts use the Scenic Roads Bylaw to protect the unique historic spatial and cultural character of their towns byways. This is achieved by careful stewardship of the trees, avoiding the destruction of stone walls, and guiding road and driveway construction.

Scenic Road designation means that written consent of the Planning Board must be obtained and a public hearing held before doing any repair, maintenance, reconstruction or paving of the road that may involve cutting or removal of trees over 4" in diameter; removal or demolition of stone walls. The hearing provides an opportunity for objection and consideration of alternative plans. Strict notice requirements must be met, with fines to \$300.

Designation of a road does not affect the community's ability to receive state aid for construction or reconstruction of the road.

While many of West Brookfield's roadways would qualify as being "scenic" in the broad sense of the term, the Town has formally designated 15 roads as scenic at this time.
