What is the purpose of a local Historical Commission?

The local Historical Commission is the agency responsible for identifying and recording the historic assets of its community and for developing and implementing a program for their recognition and preservation.

What is our primary responsibility?

Our primary responsibility is the inventory of historic assets which provide the basis for all preservation planning in the community. The commission cooperates with other municipal agencies such as the Planning Board and Conservation Commission to insure that the goals of historic preservation are considered in planning for future development of the community.

A Historical Society is a private organization formed to collect and preserve artifacts of local historical interest, which may serve to illuminate and illustrate the history of a town; preserve historical sites and landmarks and to promote the study of history.
